Introduction to the Colorado Academic Standards

## **Design Principles and Instructional Shifts**

#### Focus

The Colorado Academic Standards (CAS) emphasize what students need to be postsecondary and workforce ready.

- Articulated grade level expectations express the concepts and skills every student should master at each grade level
- 21<sup>st</sup> century information literacy, collaboration, critical thinking, self-direction, and invention skills are evident throughout the standards

#### Coherence

The CAS establish vertical and horizontal connections.

- Grade level expectations build vertically toward the achievement of the prepared graduate competencies for each content area
- Interdisciplinary relationships in the standards connect content areas (horizontally) across grade levels

#### Rigor

The CAS are written for mastery.

- Fluency, application and transfer comprise Colorado's definition of mastery
- Requirements for deeper student understanding are the foundation of the standards

#### All Students, All Standards

The CAS reflect the importance of teaching the whole child.

- The CAS include standards for 10 content areas (Comprehensive Health and Physical Education; Dance; Drama and Theatre Arts; Mathematics; Music; Reading, Writing, and Communicating; Science; Social Studies; Visual Arts; World Languages)
- Literacy skills, the basis of academic success for all students, are a prominent focus within the standards

#### Background

- 2008 Colorado Legislature passes SB 212 requiring revision of standards and alignment of the P-12 educational system. The Bill mandates each local education agency "adopts standards, at a minimum, in those subject areas that are included in the state preschool through elementary and secondary education standards, including but not limited to **English Language** Competency and Visual and Performing Arts."
- 2009 Colorado State Board of Education adopts standards in 10 content areas and for English Language Proficiency.
- 2010 (August) Colorado State Board of Education adopts the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) for Mathematics and Reading, Writing, and Communicating (RWC).
- 2010 (December) CDE releases the Colorado Academic Standards for Mathematics and RWC incorporating the CCSS.
